
- **Initially Dedicated on 23 April 2012**

- Award six \$1,000 scholarships to area high school seniors through the SW OK Chapter of MOAA Scholarship Fund.
- Award a \$1000 scholarship to a qualified ROTC cadet from Cameron University through the SW OK Chapter of MOAA Scholarship Fund.


