COL (RET) Donald C. DuRant

Donald (Don) C. DuRant currently serves as President, SWOK Chapter of MOAA. He has also served as Chapter Chaplain and Chapter Secretary.

Don was commissioned in the Field Artillery in 1974. He is a Distinguished Military Graduate of North Georgia College (now University of North Georgia). Don also holds a Master of Management from Webster University. He is a graduate of the Field Artillery Officer Basic Course, Pershing Officer Course, Field Artillery Officer Advanced Course, and Command and General Staff College Course. While on active duty, he served in Fort Sill, OK; Schwaebisch-Gmund, Germany; and Schofield Barracks, Hawaii. In 1988, he joined the US Army Reserve and served in Oklahoma City, OK; Shawnee, OK; and Fort Sill, OK.

He commanded a Pershing Missile Platoon (D Battery, 1-41 FA, 56th FA BDE), a 105mm Firing Battery (B Battery, 7-8 FA, 25th DIVARTY), a Basic Combat Training Battalion (1-377 IN, 2nd BDE, 95th Division (IT), a Simulation Exercise Group (2nd SEG, 1st BDE, 75th Division (TS). His other assignments include Battalion Assistant S-1, 1-41 FA; Gunnery Instructor, FA School; Battalion Fire Direction Officer, 3-13 FA; Division Force Modernization Officer, 25th Infantry Division; Observer-Controller-Trainer, 95th Maneuver Training Command; CGSC Instructor, 4155th USAR School; S-3, 4155th USAR School; DCSOPS (G-3), 95th Division (IT) and Chief, Combat Arms Branch, 2nd Simulation Exercise Group, 75th Division (TS). He retired in 2007 with 30 years combined active duty and USAR service.

In 1986, Don went to work as a DA Civilian in the Directorate of Combat Developments at Fort Sill. He served as Chief, Manpower and Personnel Requirements Branch; as an Organizational Integrator, Light Artillery; as Chief, Concepts and Technology; as Force Integrator, Task Force 21; and as Chief of Cannon Ammunition, TRADOC Capability Manager, Cannon Systems. He retired from government service in 2016.

Don and his wife of 50 years, Zoe, reside in Lawton, OK. They have one son, Zack, a daughter-in-law, Stephanie, two grandchildren, Zosia and John, and two cats, Scooter, and Dixie.
